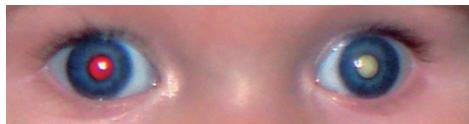

Eye cancer in young children is rare and can be treated easily if found early...

The six signs you should look out for are:



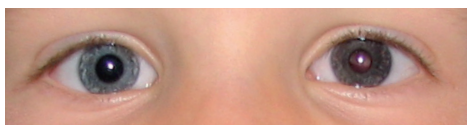
1. A white reflection in the pupil



2. A squint, where one eye looks in or out



3. A red, sore or swollen eye without infection



4. A change in the colour of the iris



5. An absence of red eye in one pupil

6. A deterioration in the child's sight

You may see one, or all, of these in an eye or a photo, but the important thing is to get the child's eyes checked quickly. A GP or Ophthalmology/eye department can do a 'red reflex' test to find out if there is anything wrong and they can refer you to see a specialist if needed.
